Everyone must sign in at the office window every time you come to volunteer or visit even for a minute between the hours of 7:30am and 3:30pm.

Gyotaku printmaking is a traditional form of Japanese art that began over 100 years ago as a way for fishermen to keep record of the fish they caught. They would apply sumi ink to one side of a freshly caught fish, then cover the fish with rice paper and rub an exact image of the fish. While this class will not be using fresh caught fish, we will be learning the technique!
